PLAYGROUND SAFETY: WHAT HAPPENS ON THE PLAYGROUND DOESN'T STAY ON THE PLAYGROUND!

(1) IDENTIFYING DEVELOPMENTAL DELAYS

This workshop session will provide descriptions of the six areas of development (motor, cognitive, language, social, emotional, and self-help) to assist child care directors in making decisions about a child’s performance in relation to typical vs. atypical development. It will also address procedures to follow once the director feels a child may have a disability.

(2) INTEGRATING SERVICES IN CHILDCARE ENVIRONMENTS

This workshop session will address the overall philosophy of natural environments and techniques for working/collaborating with other agencies who also provide services to children with disabilities such as speech therapy, physical therapy, specialized trainers, etc.

(3) HOW TO CREATE A HIGH QUALITY INCLUSIVE ENVIRONMENT

This workshop session will address how to include children with disabilities in age-appropriate groups and activities that typical developing children are enjoying. This session will include techniques for adaptations, and modifications needed for children with disabilities without disrupting the flow of the child care environment.

(4) BEHAVIOR CONCERNS AND HOW TO ADDRESS THEM

This workshop session will present an overview on the basic principles of Applied Behavioral Analysis. Child care directors will learn the skills needed to be able to observe the child’s relationship with the environment, the behavioral responses, and how the consequences effect future behaviors.
